CACD are organising two funding and information fairs on 18th and 28th September. There will be many government, funding and charitable agencies present, making themselves available to speak to you and provide literature and advice on both funding and community issues. We encourage you to attend one of these events and network with these agencies, engage with them and gain a greater understanding of the funding processes that will assist you in future applications.

Co Armagh Community Development (CACD), recently held a celebration event at Craigavon Civic Centre to mark the first year of the **"Connect2Gether"** project. This is a

peacebuilding project, led by CACD, in partnership with Clones Family Resource Centre, delivered across County Armagh and Monaghan and funded by the International Fund for Ireland (IFI). Looking to the future, "Connect2Gether" has big plans for growth, securing IFI support for a further 15 months. Key activities for phase two will include gardening workshops, training courses, music and culture workshops, dance classes and a residential. *Look out for information sessions later in September to Express an Interest in the new Project.*

We were delighted to provide an Information stand as part of our **safe food** Community Initiatives Programme at this event. We gave people the opportunity to understand food labelling through a quiz sheet, which they used to enter into a draw for fruit packs and veggie boxes. We also had a range of fruit and vegetables on the stand where the young children attending with parents were encouraged to see how many they could identify. Our visual display of sugar content in different drinks, cereals, sweets etc proved popular and was used to demonstrate to parents and children the actual sugar content in snacks.



CACD have again been successful with their bid to Cooperation Ireland to be a hub in the Circle of Learning Project.

This Circle of Learning project will commence mid-September and CACD are recruiting four local groups to take part in:

- Up to four mentoring sessions in their own venue with David or Ken.

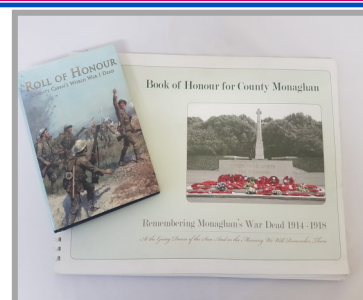
