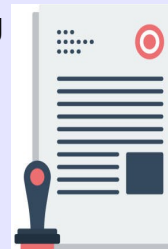




Information



The **ABC Council** assessment for those who have applied for **core running** costs, seems to becoming more stringent with the latest Call for funding. Groups are now being asked for proof of ownership or lease of the property. This has always been required for Capital funding but appears to be now in place for core running costs as well. For general basic good governance it is important for the proof of ownership, leases or constitutions to be reviewed and updated regularly.



As part of Orange Heritage Week, the annual **Diamond Day Lecture**, was held in the "Museum of Orange Heritage", Loughgall, on Thursday evening, 21 September.

The speaker was Ex Sgt Glen Espie BEM who recounted his experiences as a former Ulster Defence Regiment member, in particular the two murder attempts by Republican terrorists on him, hence the lecture title, "The Terrorist Knocked Twice". By the grace of God, he survived both, albeit with quite extensive injuries. Glen presented the Museum with a copy of the Co Tyrone Battalion Book of Remembrance for the period of the Regiment's existence, 1971-2012.
